It is both terrible and comforting to dwell in the inconceivable nearness of God, and so to be loved by God that the first and last gift is infinity and inconceivability itself. But we have no choice. God is with us. —Karl Rahner

We are about to begin a new year in the life of the church with the season of Advent (November 29). We observe the ending of the Christian year celebrating Christ the King and the ending of the growing season with a celebration of Thanksgiving. In each of these moments, we come face to face with God's nearness in all its terror and its comfort. We discover once again what it is to "dwell in the inconceivable nearness of God."

We take stock of what has been and set our eyes toward the dream of God, a full awareness of God's nearness for all the children of God. Taking stock inevitable leads to gratitude. Slowing down to notice the nearness of God that we often take for granted draws us into gratefulness. That gratefulness is the source of all our giving—as we give to the work of the church, to our loved ones, to those far away. Our gratitude erupts in a need to give. It leads us toward others in their need.

This has been a hard year for many of us as we have known death and illness. In the midst of those moments, we have perhaps known the terrible side of God's nearness as well as the comfort. For some of us, our gratitude is for survival in the midst of the storm as we await the one who is to come That experience puts us in the lineage of the ancient Hebrews as they leaned forward for the coming of the Messiah.

We will all become pregnant like Mary in these days of waiting. Let us slow down to honor the new life growing within us. As we slow down, we can become aware of our gratitude and our deep need to give.

That need to give can change the way we spend money in this season. It can change the way we spend time as we devote ourselves to worship and to the needs of others. As we look outward, we will discover the urge to invite. Each of us encounters someone whose life can be changed by an invitation into the life and worship of this faith community. Our Blue Christmas service (December 17) can be life changing for someone in grief or far from home in this season. The worship of Advent and Christmas might be the first time for someone to know that God is truly near in the Word Made Flesh.

We have no choice. God is indeed near us. Together may we discover the terror and the comfort of being loved and transformed into lovers of others.



Inquirers Class

In preparation for the visit of Bishop Susan Goff on January 31, 2016, plans are being made for an Inquirers Class for adults. Please contact the Rector if you are interested in taking part. (703-941-2922 or stbarnabasrector@outlook.com)

This class can be a refresher course or an introduction to the Christian faith and the Anglican way. Participants may choose to be presented to the bishop for baptism, confirmation, reception, or reaffirmation. Members of the church who were baptized as infants may choose to affirm their faith as adults through the rite of confirmation. In addition, those who have been confirmed in other denominations by a bishop in the historic succession (Roman Catholic, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, or Eastern Orthodox) may be received into the Episcopal Church. Those who have been baptized and confirmed but wish to recommit themselves to the life of faith may choose to reaffirm their baptismal covenant.

Most of all, the class is a time to delve deeper, to ask questions, and to share our spiritual growth with others. We will make use of a variety of resources including the January sessions of the adult forum. Please contact the Rector as soon as possible to express your interest in participation. The schedule will be determined as participants are identified.

Beginnings – St. Barnabas' Book Group

The St. Barnabas' Book Group, **Beginnings**, will meet on Monday, December 7, 7:30 p.m., at the home of Joan and Lee Gibbs. We will discuss the book, *Pleading, Cursing, Praising: Conversing with God through the Psalms*, by Irene Nowell, a Benedictine nun who is also a Biblical scholar. We will meet again on Monday, January 4 (book yet to be chosen).

Work Zone Ahead - Getting Started on the WSR Project!

We have now have passed all of the Fairfax County reviews and have been granted a building permit for the Worship Space Renewal (WSR) project. Our plans passed the county zoning, building, mechanical, electrical and Fire Marshal reviews. Our next step is to establish a project start date. We anticipate work beginning on Monday, November 30 with project completion no later than Friday, December 18!

Our \$25,000 grant from the Diocese of Virginia requires that the church match this grant dollar for dollar. The total project cost is likely to exceed \$59,000, so we started with the goal to raise at least \$20,000 from contributions. We have now received well over half of this amount. All contributions are welcome and we invite your prayerful consideration about supporting this work. Please mark your check as being for "Worship Space Renewal."

Last year, church members reached out to invite others to take part in this service designed to include everyone, and discovered the healing and hope it can bring. This simple service is a chance to lift up the pain and prepare to enter more fully the feast of the Christ Child who came amongst us in the midst of pain and loss.



Annandale Safe Youth Project

Christmas Alert: The ASYP Christmas Party will be held on December 15 due to this year's school calendar. I'll need gifts for the children by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 9</u>. The wrapping party will be <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 14</u>, in the Education Wing. I will have the wish slips in a yellow folder in the narthex by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 18</u>. So far, we only have ten children so this should be do-able. Alternative House just offered the job of Coordinator to someone new and she is starting on her paperwork. She seemed to be excited about the job. We will keep our fingers crossed this time.

You may have seen the headline, "Annandale Man Charged with Raping Fairfax City Child." Well, that Annandale man lived in my neighborhood and the child was under the age of 13. I checked to see if Det. Bill Woolf had been given any help yet, only to find that the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has not committed to funding the human trafficking unit again. The other side of the coin is that the pimps and johns (rapists) are not being pursued either because of shortage of police to do so! The thought of giving gangs more power sends shivers down my spine.

We know that the problem is exploding in the schools and that gangs are running more than 50 percent of the teen sex trafficking! That this is not considered a high priority is mind blowing. Should we just let the gangs take over? Should we continue to stick our heads in the sand about this horrible problem?

I spoke to Braddock District Supervisor John Cook's chief of staff and he confirmed that the Board of Supervisors had not yet committed to this. The next budget will not be marked up until next spring but it is *very important that we all* let our District Supervisors and the Chairman At-Large, Sharon Bulova, know how we feel about protecting our teens (and adults) from being turned into sex slaves, and ruining families. Let your voice be heard, everyone *can* make a difference.
