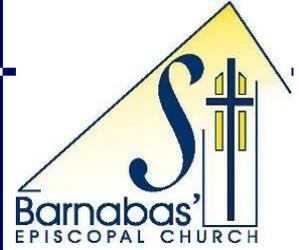

Participation of Children

As Stephen Ackert and I were meeting to plan music for the weeks ahead we found ourselves discussing how to make worship more meaningful for the younger children. I am always pleased when I see adults serving up front helping acolytes to find their place in the bulletin, find the right page in the right book, and participate to the best of their ability.

Children who don't know how to participate are bored to death. Years ago, when we had a sort of "First Communion" process, we had an opportunity to educate kids on how to participate. Now it falls to parents, although it's possible no one has told them!

Going forward, Stephen is going to merge adults and children in the choir loft so the children have adults who can mentor them, encourage them to make the responses, sing the service music, recite the Creed and Lord's Prayer, and to sing – out loud and in front of God and everybody!

When young people know what's expected and how to participate, how to read a bulletin, find a hymn, and make the planned responses, it is MUCH less boring, and over time much more meaningful.

If you are a parent or someone who often sits next to a child, feel free to assist this effort. *We* know worship is not a "spectator sport," but our children do need a little help. Let's take this on as an Advent discipline and help them prepare for Christmas.



Vestry Highlights—November 2019



- Mr. Miller announced that the FACETS program has not used all of the money in its 2019 budget. Since the program is going so well and is financially efficient, Mr. Miller will request a decrease for the 2020 budget, from \$3,600 to \$2,400
- The Vestry approved a change in payroll provider to ADP Payroll Services beginning January 2020.
- A Resolution was approved appointing Lyn Willis Harris as new Trustee to replace Sujatha Augustine. The Trustees are Ken Mittelholtz, Carolyn Lilienthal, and Lyn Harris.
- Mr. Westerlund provided the minutes of the November meeting of the Finance Committee. The report shows that St. Barnabas' is in good financial shape, with income exceeding expenses. The committee is drafting a budget for 2020, to be presented to the Vestry in December.
- Mr. Westerlund and Mr. Carroll are working to enhance the St. Barnabas' webpage.
- Canon Flanagan suggested that we include a reminder to the congregation for the use of Amazon Smiles for shopping. Amazon will send St. Barnabas' a cash back percentage of purchases through this program.
- The Annual Meeting will be November 24 at 9:15 a.m. (between services). A draft of the agenda for the meeting was discussed and approved. The Minutes of the Annual Meeting will be approved by the Vestry.
- A draft of the Stewardship Statement of the Vestry was approved and signed by all Vestry members who were present.
- Mr. Carroll mentioned that the Stewardship Committee has not yet heard from 9 people who pledged last year. The Committee will follow up with them. The dollar amount of the pledges received so far exceeds last year's figure. It was suggested that we provide pledge cards and other parish information to newcomers.
- Nominations for the Vestry's Class of 2022 are Dawn Schaefer, Sheena Friend, and Behn Ayala.
- The Vestry approved Beth Harper as Alternate to Diocesan Convention for a two-year term. Katie Westerlund will serve as Delegate for a two-year term, following her two years as Alternate.
- Our newest bishop, Jennifer Brooke-Davidson, will visit St. Barnabas' on December 15, 2019.
- While Rotha Frye is out, Deborah Batten and James Carroll have agreed to help organize the ASYP Holiday Party.



Stewardship Committee 2019 Report

“Wonder in All,” the theme developed by the Diocese of Virginia, inspired our 2020 pledge drive. Most pledges were received on Ingathering Sunday, October 27. As of November 10th we had received 59 pledges, for a total of \$334,300, representing 81% of the number of pledges (adults) from last year, and 97% of the dollars (adults) from last year. We have also received nine children’s pledges, five include financial commitments. The Stewardship Committee will be making follow-up contacts with those who have not yet pledged, and will wrap up in December with acknowledgement letters and envelopes for those who requested them.

This year, again, the children’s stewardship campaign includes pledges of time and talent, including: participating in a Halloween “candy tithe,” participating in a Saint Barnabas’ work day and/or service day, and service through acolyting, children’s choir, or other recurring parish activities. As an act of stewardship and service, the youth will again prepare breakfast bags for the February hypothermia shelter (in partnership with St. Patrick’s).

In the first half of 2020, the committee will be looking to organize a stewardship event wherein all generations come together for a few hours to serve others. We are looking to provide service opportunities such as writing cards/letters for shut-ins, packing snack bags, and other similar activities. Stay tuned for more details, and let us know if you’d be willing to help plan and/or support this event!

“Wonder in All” are words of relationship from our baptism liturgy. They are also a call to action for each of us – a call to increase the wonders of God’s work in our parish, community, and the world. They are a call to increase where God is calling all of us at St. Barnabas’. We are incredibly grateful for those who have made an ongoing commitment to use the gifts God gives us to do the work God calls us to do.
