Dear Friends,

In the Muppet rendition of *A Christmas Carol*, one of the concluding songs, "It feels Like Christmas" reminds us that at Christmas, it is, "A special time of caring / The ways of love made clear / And it is the season of the spirit / The message if we hear it / Is make it last all year"

Making the spirit of Christmas "last all year" is indeed a powerful and lifegiving message and aspiration. Even though things aren't completely back to "normal" yet—we are still wearing masks, running indoor air filters, ventilating spaces as much as we are able, and maintaining physical distance in our sanctuary—I'm thankful for the

opportunity we do have to prepare the way for our celebration of the Feast of the Incarnation. Please note that for the first time in recent memory, due to limited space in the Sanctuary, **the Regathering Committee has asked those who would like to gather in person to please make a reservation for Christmas Eve services ahead of time,** and to do this with as much advance notice as possible, for our two separate gatherings starting at 4:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Please call the Parish Office if you are unable to come to church in person to make your reservation. Reservations for 75 individuals at each service will be available on a first come, first served basis. At the time of this writing, and given sign-ups at the Annual Meeting, we are accepting waitlist reservations for our 4:30 p.m. service and are planning to livestream our 4:30 p.m. service on YouTube for those who prefer to worship from home. Nave reservations are only available for our 7:00 p.m. service. Overflow seating in the Richardson Room is available for the 4:30 p.m. service, however.

Amid the challenges of this time, and as you prepare for this particular Advent and Christmas, I hope that you will find it a special time of caring, when the ways of love are indeed made clear.

## Vestry Highlights - November 17, 2021

- Vestry agreed to participate in the Hypothermia Shelter program for 2022. We are offering to provide dinner and breakfast. Cindy McLaughlin is the leader for this activity.
- Christmas Eve services will be held at 4:30 and 7:00 p.m. The Sunrise String Quartet is providing musical preludes at both services. Stephen Ackert will provide organ music for both services, and the St. Barnabas' Band is playing in the 4:30 p.m. service, when masked congregational singing is also encouraged.
- Since we are limited to 75 people in the nave at any one time, we will be accepting reservations for both services. We will use the Narthex and Richardson Room for any overflow at the 4:30 p.m. service.
- The final draft of the position announcement for the Coordinator of Christian Education was reviewed and approved.
- The evaluation of the church building's energy efficiency options is ongoing. The Building & Grounds Committee recommended that we use monies in the Endowment Fund to upgrade our lighting system with LED bulbs and new fixtures where necessary; the Vestry approved the Building & Grounds Committee's recommendations.
- The Treasurer announced that our finances are in good shape. The Vestry approved salary increases for the church staff and the salary we could offer to the new Minister of Music.

## Christmas Services and a Return to Congregational Singing (Masked)

Christmas is always a joyful time at St Barnabas'. The Rector, Regathering Committee, and Music Committee have been working together to make plans for a safe celebration of the birth of Christ, while including as many of our traditional activities as possible.

For the first time in several years, we are planning two services on Christmas Eve, with the first at 5:00 p.m. including a musical prelude at 4:30 p.m., and the second at 7:00 p.m. Masks will be required at both services.

We feel that having two services is the best way to accommodate as many people as possible while maintaining the social distancing that will keep everyone safe. We know that the early service on Christmas Eve is a popular one, and we are asking you to sign up for the service you plan to attend. Please reserve your space early, if you know which one you would like to attend, as spaces in the Nave may be claimed quickly.

With current distancing guidelines, we expect to have space for about 75 individuals in the Nave at a time. If the number of people wishing to attend the 5:00 p.m. service (with musical prelude at 4:30 p.m.) on December 24 goes above the number we can accommodate in the Nave, we are seeking to arrange for overflow seating in the narthex or Richardson Room. The early service will also be livestreamed from the church for those who prefer to participate from home.

On Christmas Day, there will be a short Noonday Prayer service on Zoom, also accessible via phone. On Sunday, December 26 we will have one service of Lessons & Carols with Holy Eucharist, beginning at 10:15 a.m.

There have been a number of questions to the Regathering Committee and our musicians about when we will be able to return to congregational singing. We have decided that our 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service is an appropriate time to return to this muchloved activity. For those who prefer a Christmas Eve service without singing, our 7:00 p.m. service is intended to be instrumental only, with no congregational singing.


Our decision about singing at the 5:00 p.m. service was based the dropping case rate of COVID-19 in our area, the possibility for children age 5 and up to receive the vaccine, and the Diocese of Virginia's decision to allow singing by congregations if all are masked and socially distanced. We have also improved the air exchange rate in the church spaces with additional air filters. In addition to masks, we will have marked the seating in the church pews in order to ensure the required distancing. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation. **Baptized**




